Why choose Naming Rights?

The donations generated by this initiative will provide the Library with a dependable and crucial revenue stream called an endowment. It can be a significant source of funding not dependent on property tax revenue. For donors, the benefits are equally impressive. A named space offers a permanent and highly visible recognition to an individual, family, organization, or business. It can be a memorial to a loved one or a tribute to an entire family. Few other types of donations can create such an impressive legacy.

Why choose the Library?

Our libraries are important community hubs that offer significant educational, recreational, and social opportunities for EVERYONE. Libraries make communities better places in which to live. Insuring that they have the funding to fulfill their mission has far-reaching results — not just for one person or one family in need, but for all those who seek the assistance and resources of the library — every day of every year.

Why build an endowment?

Endowments preserve the donation, thus creating a forever gift. Donations invested safely with the intent of using the income generated by the principal can last "forever".

What is an example of a named space?

The Crest Hill Lions Computer Instruction Lab and the Jeanne Juricic Crest Hill History Room are two examples. The Library worked closely with these donors to name the spaces appropriately.

Is the donation tax deductible?

Yes, the donation is a charitable tax deduction as allowed by law, because it is being made to the Library Foundation, which is a 501(c)3 entity.

Can the donation be made with a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

Yes, if you are 70.5 years old, a direct transfer from your IRA will not be treated as taxable income. However, the tax deduction will not also apply.
